October 2021:

Friday 8 October 11.00 am: The Lynmouth Floods: Act of God or Act of Man? - Pam Hogan

Many remember the summer of 1952 when disaster struck the small fishing village of Lynmouth on the North Devon coast (which has topographical similarities to Lyme Regis). During one August night, flash floods destroyed scores of homes and claimed 34 lives. But not so many recall suspicions that emerged at the time of Government interference with the weather. Fact or fiction? Pam's talk uncovers the incredible facts that create the backdrop for her novel 'Seeds of Doubt', many discovered in top secret government documents of the time. This multi-media presentation will include information from those documents, book readings and anecdotes about the research and writing process.

Risk assessments

Following the Government's relaxation of the COVID regulations on July 19th the National u3a organisation has revised its requirements for restarting face to face meetings. The requirements can be found in section 4 of

Essentially a system with two layers of protection is advocated for face to face events and meetings. The first layer is the personnel risk assessment to reduce the risk of the infection being taken into the group meetings and events. The second layer is a risk assessment to reduce the transmission of the virus during meetings and events.

The aim is for each group to reduce risks to a level that is acceptable to the group leader and members and ensures that all attendees are comfortable with their participation. In this way it is hoped that many groups will return to normal activities as the pandemic finally recedes.
